1. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Gallagher called the meeting to order at 1:05 p.m.

2. ROLL CALL

Mr. Gallagher asked Deputy Clerk Carter to call the roll. Committee members Gallagher, Tuma and Kelly were in attendance and a quorum was determined. Committee members Conwell and Simon were in attendance after the roll call was taken. Council President Jones was also in attendance.

3. PUBLIC COMMENT

There were no public comments given.

4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM THE APRIL 18, 2023 MEETING

A motion was made by Mr. Tuma, seconded by Mr. Kelly and approved by unanimous vote to approve the minutes from the April 18, 2023 meeting.

- 5. MATTERS REFERRED TO COMMITTEE
 - a) <u>O2023-0005</u>: An Ordinance renumbering Section 202.07 of the Cuyahoga County Code to 204.02 and to clarify the duties of the County Sheriff's Department and the County Sheriff; and declaring the necessity that this Ordinance become immediately effective.

Mr. Gallagher addressed Ordinance No. O2023-0005 and stated that former County Executive Ed FitzGerald submitted a letter to the Committee. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Kelly introduced a proposed substitute to Ordinance No. O2023-0005. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Gregory Huth, Law Director, addressed the Committee regarding Ordinance No. O2023-0005. Discussion ensued.

Committee members and Councilmembers asked questions of Mr. Huth pertaining to the item, which he answered accordingly.

There was no further legislative action taken on Ordinance No. O2023-0005.

WHEREAS, Cuyahoga County received \$239,898,257 from the Federal Government through the American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA"); and

WHEREAS, Cuyahoga County calculated 100% of the ARPA dollars as loss revenue under the U.S. Department of the Treasury Final Rule; and

WHEREAS, since all the ARPA dollars have been calculated as loss revenue, the ARPA dollars have been deposited in the County's General Fund; and

WHEREAS, the County Executive and County Council have authorized \$86 million of the ARPA dollars for community grants to benefit the residents of Cuyahoga County (the "ARPA Community Grant Fund"); and

WHEREAS, of the \$86 million for community grants, \$66 million have been encumbered for equal distribution to each County Council District; and

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Council desires to provide funding from the District 1 ARPA Community Grant Fund in the amount of \$12,851.65 to the City of Rocky River for the replacement of Automated External Defibrillators; and

WHEREAS, the City of Rocky River estimates approximately 21,137 people will be served annually through this award; and

WHEREAS, the City of Rocky River estimates the total cost of the project is \$12,851.65; and

WHEREAS, the City of Rocky River is estimating the project will begin immediately upon funding; and

WHEREAS, the City of Rocky River requested \$12,851.65 from the District 1 ARPA Community Grant Fund to complete this project; and

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Council desires to provide funding in the amount of \$12,851.65 to the City of Rocky River to ensure this project is completed; and

WHEREAS, this Council by a vote of at least eight (8) members determines that it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue to provide for the usually, daily operations of the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

- **SECTION 1.** That the Cuyahoga County Council hereby awards a not-to-exceed amount of \$12,851.65 to the City of Rocky River from the General Fund made available by the American Rescue Plan Act revenue replacement provision for the replacement of Automated External Defibrillators.
- **SECTION 2.** If any specific appropriation is necessary to effectuate this agreement, the Director of the Office of Budget and Management is authorized to submit the requisite documentation to financial reporting to journalize the appropriation.
- **SECTION 3.** That the County Council staff is authorized to prepare all documents to effectuate said award.
- **SECTION 4.** That the County Executive is authorized to execute all necessary agreements and documents consistent with said award and this Resolution.
- **SECTION 5.** If requested or necessary, the Agency of the Inspector General or Department of Internal Audit is authorized to investigate, audit, or review any part of this award.
- **SECTION 6.** To the extent that any exemptions are necessary under the County Code and contracting procedures, they shall be deemed approved by the adoption of this Resolution.
- **SECTION 7.** It is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health or safety in the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

SECTION 8. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

The AEDs will be used by Rocky River patrol officers and auxiliary officers. All residents and guests of the Rocky River Community will benefit from the deployment of AEDs in police patrol vehicles and on the marine patrol vessel.
How many people will be served annually: All residents, workers, and guests that visit the Rocky River community will be better served with the addition of AEDs in police patrol vehicles. Current residential population in Rocky River is 21,137. The City has a robust retail and restaurant presence that bring many visitors every day.
